 - US Peru on meat safety standards

Nanotechnology in our food?

- US: titanium dioxide in donuts (As You Sow)
- Germany: nanosilver cutting board
- China: ultrasonic fruit and vegetable cleaner
 - The inventory now includes 1,317 products, and has grown 521% since March 2006. Europe has overtaken East Asia as the second greatest contributor of manufacturer-identified nanotechnology-enabled consumer products, though the USA still contributes the most.

Precautionary Principle

 When an activity raises threats of harm to human health or the environment, precautionary measures should be taken even if some cause and effect relationships are not fully established scientifically.

> No health and safety data, no market.

Finding a new path on standards

- Slow movement at FDA
 - not Generally Recognized As Safe
 - Bias toward economic benefits
- European Food Safety Authority guidance
- EU Public Consultation on nanomaterials

> Imperative use of precautionary principle

Controversial food additives

- Dubious additives
 - Bovine Growth Hormone
 - Chlorine rinses for poultry
 - Ractopamine
 - Controversy at Codex
 - Danish pork industry changes
 - Banned in China
